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Struck Off! *with Dr. Niamh Nic Gearailt*

(ANAEMIA)

Anemia is a condition in which you lack enough healthy red blood cells to carry adequate oxygen to your body's tissues.

Having anemia can make you feel tired and weak. I know that in my own Medical Council hearing, when it was decided that I be struck off the medical register, simply

listening to the medical council's rationale made me seriously consider if I was anaemic.

Your typical doctor will check for signs and symptoms such as fatigue, tiredness, dizziness or lightheadedness. Signs of anemia may also include a pale complexion and an abnormally smooth tongue. However, a sure fire method of determining if you have anaemia, is not based upon what you feel, but rather on what you don't feel.

If you do not feel like watching your favourite television show, eating your favourite chocolate bar or in particular, masturbating, then I've got news for you, it's likely to be anaemia.

Iron deficiency anaemia, or "*Popeye Syndrome*" as I like to call it, is a deficiency of iron in the body. This is likely caused by an iron poor diet. Most often this can be remedied by increasing your daily intake of red meat, beans or powdered iron granules,

One of the biggest problems with iron deficiency anaemia, is actually getting to a doctor to diagnose it. This is the anaemia working against your body, making you too exhausted and lazy to make that appointment with your local GP.

If your Doctor suspects you have iron deficiency anaemia, they will take a blood sample from you to aid their diagnosis. With this sample a full blood count will be made. And you can be informed in 3-4 days of your results.

Usually an iron supplement is prescribed, which can come in a tablet or liquid sachet form. With 1-2 weeks you should be feeling back on form, with a renewed energy, ready to take your appeal to the High Court against the Medical Council, or finally getting round to clearing out the shed.

PHONE PHANTOM STRIKES AGAIN

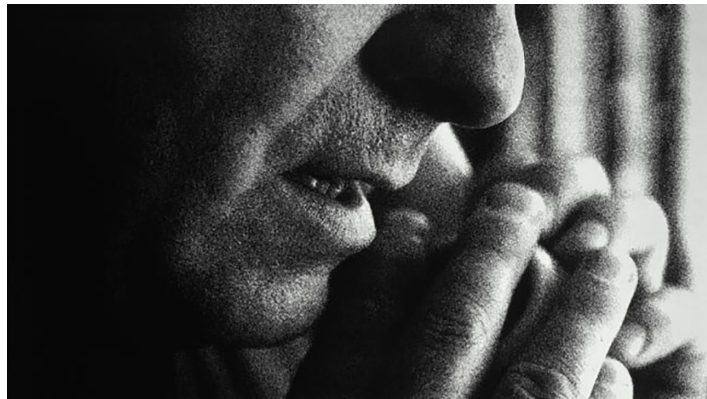
There has been another case of an obscene phone call in Glanmire this month. On this occasion the unwilling recipient was Siobhan Carey, 64, of Copper Valley View.

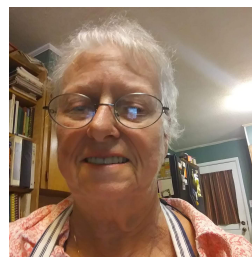
With her only daughter looking on from just over 5000 miles away, Mrs. Carey recoiled in shock and horror when she was met with a stream of phone filth.

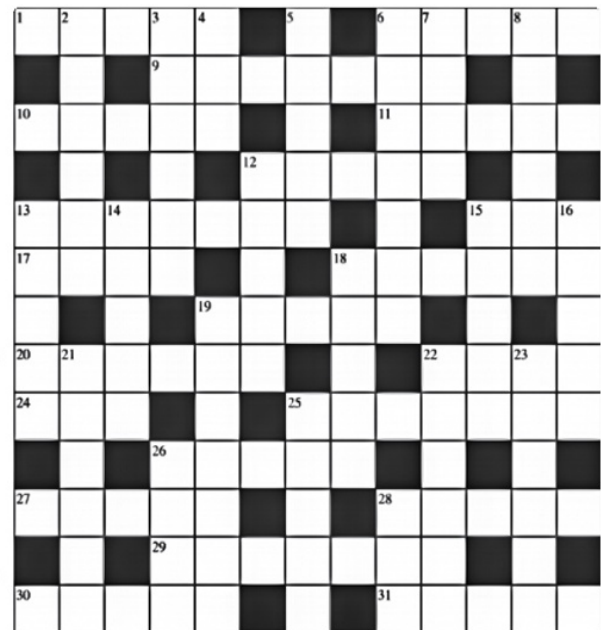
